Thailand performed exceptionally well beating the current holders Singapore in the first game and then beating Hong Kong in a close game. A loss to Oman put Thailand out of the Semi Finals. Thailand beat Bahrain to be placed 5th in the ranking.

National Youth Games are considered to be the pinnacle youth sport competition in Thailand. 12 provincial boys and 7 provincial girls cricket teams took part in this year's games. The junior ethnic cricketers from across Thailand competed in a total of 33 matches over 9 days at the Alan Cooke Cricket Ground.
